

Abuse, Neglect, Exploitation, or Domestic Violence

Adult Protection Services/Child Protection Services 877-597-2331

Provides consultation and state program guidance for child protective services cases.

Crime Victim Advocate Commonwealth's Attorney Office 270-756-2791

Help victims understand their rights and keep informed of all court dates. Accompany victims and witnesses to court. Provide emotional support and help file for financial aid through the Crime Victim Compensation Board. Notify victims when criminals are released into custody. Inform victims and witnesses of all probation or parole hearings so they may have input to the process. Identify services needed by victims, witnesses, and their families and refer to appropriate agencies.

The Kentucky Coalition Against Domestic Violence (KCADV) 502-209-5382 Provides a strong, statewide voice on behalf of survivors and their children. KCADV administers \$13 million in state and federal funds to its 15 member programs, runs a Certification Program for all domestic violence program staff including 30 hours of classroom instruction, and operates an Economic Empowerment Program serving survivors across the state.

Child Crisis Stabilization Unit 270-756-5816

The Children's Crisis Unit is a 12-bed, 24-hour alternative to inpatient psychiatric hospitalization. It is a non-medical unit with the goal of helping youth ages 4 to 18 return to pre-crisis level of functioning. Youth admitted to the unit receive a combination of individual therapy, family and group therapy, nursing services, and psychiatric evaluations with medication management follow-up.
